Sensory Pathway

The money raised from our Silver Circle Draw will be used to fund a sensory pathway along the corridor in the new section of the building. Sensory spaces are a fun and engaging way for children to get their wiggles out, refocus during a transition or self-soothe after facing a difficult challenge. These

paths are created to be colorful and playful and turn a passive environment into an active one. Not only do they add more physical activity to a child's day, they can also be designed to help them practice a variety of skills and just play. Ms. Conmy and Ms. O'Dea have been busy in recent weeks developing ideas for our sensory pathway. Our pathway will use 'Nature' as its theme and we hope that it will be in place before the midterm break in February. It will be a very exciting addition to the school and will benefit many of our pupils.

New Flooring

We have a number of projects planned in the school over the holidays. We will be replacing the carpet on our main corridor and replacing it with a marmoleum flooring. This type of flooring is more hygenic, brighter and easier to maintain. We will also plan on painting the hallway in the new section of the school in preparation for our sensory pathway.
