Return to School

As of now, the school will open again on Monday 31st August. The Department of Education and Skills did issue some guidance on Friday afternoon regarding the reopening of schools for next year. You will have read some commentary in the media on this. The major stumbling block when it comes to reopening is the social distancing

requirements that are in place at present. The Department seems to be advocating a 'wait and see' approach with regard to the 2 metre rule in place as of now. The Department's stated objective is to have a full reopening of schools in late August. The hope is that schools will be able to return in the normal way. There is an acceptance that social distancing requirements are very difficult to obey in a school setting. Obviously these requirements will be dictated by public health advice at the time of reopening. All schools are awaiting further guidance and clarification as to how we will return. Increased hand sanitisation, enhanced cleaning regimes and restricted movements within schools will form part of the guidance when it arrives during the summer. The school will provide further clarification for parents once it is issued by the Departments.

In an effort to keep things as normal as possible, we will be sending booklists, reports and next year's classes out to parents by post this week. We have allocated classes in the normal way using our Class Allocation Policy.
